OE Philanthropy and Social Impact: Purpose – the 'Why?'

"To accelerate and enhance the philanthropic impact of the OE community by advocating and actively encouraging OE philanthropy and involvement in social impact"

The 'How?'

- By developing a network of OEs interested and active in philanthropy and social impact:
 - Facilitating connections and relationships
 - Providing an opportunity for like-minded OEs to generate ideas, collaborate, and take action
 - Being a source of information eg. best practice, case studies, links to relevant organisations etc.
- By providing a resource for staff and boys currently at Eton: inspiration, information, connections, opportunities etc.

Key Principles and Approach

- Open and flexible
 - Deliberately not focussing on any specific area of philanthropy or social impact, taking account of the potentially wide range of interest and experience
 - Allow (and support) specific individual and group interests to emerge, develop and coalesce organically over time
- A 'safe space': for discussion and connection, assumption of 'no solicitation', application of the Chatham House rule
- Developing and sharing a common purpose collegiate, low ego



- Across generations and geographies
- **Collaborative:** seeking opportunities to work with OEEESS, Etonpreneurs and other OE societies where interests and ambitions align
- Not a forum through which the School will seek to raise funds directly.

Who is it for?

- Philanthropists and donors those with funds to distribute
- **Practitioners** inc. those working in social impact charities/NGOs, social enterprises and similar organisations
- Philanthropy and social impact **professionals** eg. advisors, consultants, policy professionals etc
- The 'foot soldiers' eg. philanthropic volunteers, trustees etc.
